



# What is Title I?

Title I is a program that provides additional academic support and learning opportunities for students at schools with high percentages of socioeconomically disadvantaged children.

The program is intended to help ensure that all students meet state academic standards.

Ben Hulse School receives federal money for our enrollment of free/reduced lunch numbers. The money is used to improve academic achievement in reading and math. The Title 1 funds are used to hire instructional aides, improve curriculum instruction, enhance parent involvement and extend learning time for students who need extra help. These opportunities are provided to students throughout the school.



- a plan of actions to raise the academic performance of all students to the level of performance goals established under the California Academic Performance Index.
- a comprehensive document providing details about the school's planned actions and expenditures to support student outcomes and overall performance, and how these actions connect to the District's Local Control Accountability Plan (LCAP).

## Student/Parent/School Compact

A school-parent compact is a written agreement between the school and the parents of children participating in Title I, Part A programs that identifies the activities that the parents, the entire school staff, and the students will undertake to share the responsibility for improved student academic achievement.
